## **Short Story Competitions Rules & Information:**

- 1. Entrants should submit a single story, typed, by email to story@kreolmagazine.com
- 2. Those submitting more than one entry will be disqualified.
- 3. You cannot send amendments or further drafts once your story has been submitted. Once submitted, story cannot be revised or re-submitted in other forms.
- 4. Submissions must be a short story between 1800 and 2000 words in length, written in English
- 5. The contests are open to residents of the UK and overseas, and participants must enter under their resident address. Students must give their parental address, if any, not a college or university address.
- 6. Each story must have a title.
- 7. The decision of the judges is final and incontestable and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 8. No materials or additional submissions of poetry will be returned.
- 9. The organisers reserve the right to cancel any competition at any stage, if deemed necessary, and if circumstances arise out of their control.
- 10. You cannot use a pen name or enter story for or on behalf of another person, living or dead. You cannot submit entries as the guardian or parent of the author.
- 11. Do not send cassettes, CDs, etc with your poetry. They cannot be returned to you.
- 12. The organisers do not accept any responsibility for late entries.
- 13. All winners may be required to take part in promotional activities and publicity for the book and competition.
- 14. Entries must not have been previously published or submitted for publication or for other competitions. Once a story has been submitted to this competition it must not be entered into any other competition or offered for use, publication or broadcasting in any form or medium throughout the world until the end of the competition. Entrants will be deemed to have agreed not to offer their entries to other broadcasters or publishers or for any use or exploitation up to the end of the competition.
- 15. Entries must not have appeared on any website prior to or during the running of the competition. They must not have been self-published or published by loan in any form whatsoever, in a book, magazine or any other form of publication or media.
- 16. The story must be the original work of the entrant submitting it. By entering the competition, entrants warrant and undertake to the organisers that (i) their work is original, containing no defamatory matter (provided, however, that they shall not be liable for any defamatory matter which, in the opinion of the organisers, was included in the story without negligence or malice on their part), and (ii) does not contain any third party copyright material or quotes without appropriate permission having been obtained and identified to the organisers when the entry is submitted.
